Annual Report 2021



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"We are more than JUST books." This is the slogan we've added to our brochure based on feedback from our volunteers. It's true. We are so much more. Books in the hands of children are VITAL, but there is much more than "just books" that is important and involved in the work that we do. In our community work, we are asked a variety of questions and they always make me think critically about what we do and how we can improve not only our program, but also our communications. Once upon a time, someone said to me, "How do you know what they do with the books? How do you know they aren't burning the books?" Of course, I was fully taken aback and I seriously reflected on that. In the end, my response was, "If that family is *so in need* that they are cold and the books provide warmth, then the books still served a purpose." But you know, more than being put IN a fire (which is highly unlikely), with our books and language & literacy materials, we are trying to provide INNER warmth and set their brains ON fire!

Beyond the beautiful books that we distribute to children – which DO help them think, imagine, experience new language and concepts, and, according to a multitude of research, stimulate cognitive growth – we also provide children with materials to encourage playing and writing. Not only do these activities increase cognition, they also increase language experiences, which are foundational to future life success. FURTHER, playing, writing, and reading provide children with outlets for stress relief AND healthy ways to express emotions while they explore alternative solutions to problems of the moment. Playing, writing, and reading are all well documented ways to help improve COGNITION, LANGUAGE, SELF-ESTEEM, and MENTAL HEALTH.

During the first 5 years of life is when the MOST brain growth happens. 90% of brain development occurs in these early years – more than any other time. The neural connections that are emerging and strengthening during this period aren't just the ones needed for reading. The connections being formed are also ones needed for language, empathy, coping with emotions, and interacting with others. In other words, this is the time when the brain is forming the capacity to be fully human – to cooperate peacefully to solve problems, generate ideas, create, and love!

In the counties we serve, at least 1 out of every 2 children in these first five years of life are living at or just above poverty. While their families are struggling to put food on the table and maintain a home, they are unlikely to have the left-over means to purchase materials for playing, writing, and reading. Without easy access to playing and print materials in the home, stimulation is less available. One of our recent partners at a low-income health clinic told us the story relayed by one of their physicians. The doctor asked a parent of a toddler what the child's favorite toy was. The response was that her little boy loved a spoon. This was not because the child gnored other toys in favor of the spoon, but because the spoon was all there was. Upon receipt of our first delivery to the clinic, the same doctor was elated to immediately share our materials with her families!

Of course, the brain – and the whole child – doesn't stop needing positive stimulation after 5. This is why we have a firm plan. We start our community work with the youngest, and as the children grow, we continue with language and literacy materials in these communities at pantries, preschools, elementary schools, and beyond. Our goal is to provide a long-term, steady supply of language and literacy materials to children in need so they may strengthen their capacity for life.

As a grass-roots, volunteer-led and volunteer-powered organization (with one part-time employee), we engage each day to intentionally and systematically make a difference in the lives of children in Michigan using research-driven practices. We are dynamic, constantly striving and improving our work in an effort to find the best methods and materials to achieve our mission. We closely collaborate with our community partners, professionals who are distributing our materials to children and families, taking their feedback to heart while we make adaptations and improvements to fulfill our mission.

Above all, children deserve our careful attention because EVERY CHILD MATTERS. What we do TODAY for children fully impacts children's lives TOMORROW. There is so much work to be done in so many places. We couldn't do what we do without YOU. This thank you note from one of our little friends says it all, "Thanks for seeing my future."

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





